


## Days Without End

## <u>House of Impossible Beauties</u> Joseph Cassara




anger he felt after getting kicked out of his private school, and all the changes—both mental and physical—he experienced once his transition began.

## Fun Home Alison Bechdel

fatherhood, the Scientology hierarchy, transsexual life, LGBTQ politics, and life on the road as a sought-after speaker.







He's a pioneer who changed the perception of an entire community, and his memoir, BALLS, will touch readers' hearts and change quite a few minds.


## Black Girl Dangerous






Two Boys Kissing
